Chapter 55 of the Code of the Village of Malone is hereby amended to reflect the addition of Article III: Removal of Dangerous Trees, which will contain the following language:

ARTICLE III: Removal of Dangerous Trees §55-4 – Emergency Cases

"In cases where it reasonably appears that a tree presents an immediate danger to the life or safety of any person within the Village of Malone, and said tree is not immediately removed by the property owner, the Code Enforcement Officer shall report such facts to the Village Board of Trustees who shall then have the authority to order the immediate removal of said unsafe tree. The cost of such emergency removal shall be the responsibility of the property owner, billable by invoice from the Village of Malone. Any unpaid invoices shall be re-levied to the property owners Village Property Tax Bill."

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, this Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State.
