Resolution 9-2020 – Mill Park Emergency Handrails

VILLAGE OF MALONE RESOLUTION NO. 9-2020

AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF MALONE TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY ACTION TO AWARD A CONTRACT IN EXCESS OF THE VILLAGE PROCUREMENT LAW

WHEREAS, the Village of Malone has NYS Department of State grant funding in place to complete the Mill Park on the Salmon River Project (Project), which expires March 31st 2020, and

WHEREAS, the Village of Malone bid the Project on two separate occasions, and received only a single bid, and

WHEREAS, the multiple rounds of bidding resulted in the loss of significant 2019 construction season, and

WHEREAS, the Village of Malone contracted with Northroute Development Corp. who has not met the Project established substantial completion date of November 8, 2019, and contractor does not have the available funds to purchase the custom manufactured handrails for the Project, and

WHEREAS, the Village is in jeopardy of losing the grant funding if the Project is not completed prior to March 31st, 2020, and

WHEREAS, two proposals have been received from railing manufactures with the lowest dollar value being \$42,000 (attached as Exhibit A), and

WHEREAS, the proposed solution is for the Village to purchase the custom manufactured handrails for the Project, and

WHEREAS, these costs will be deducted from the contractor's Project bid, via contract deduction change order (attached as Exhibit B), which will not result in an increase in the Project budget, and

WHEREAS, the procurement of the handrails was not publicly bid, but failure to purchase and install these railings prior to March 31st, 2020 is an unanticipated and unexpected occurrence beyond the Village's control, which will threaten the health and safety of the public use of the Mill Park property, and

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, that the Village of Malone does hereby declare a public health & safety emergency for the Project, and authorizes a contract deduction change order in the amount of \$42,000 to proceed with an emergency project purchase of the Project handrails.
